



LITTLE FLOATING-HEART Nymphoides cordata

Habitat Preference

Found in freshwater ponds and lakes, as well as in slow-moving rivers and streams.

Characteristics



Vegetative Heart to oval shaped floating leaves, three to seven centimeters with reddish-purple tinge, alternate arrangement - one leaf per *node* (12).

Flowers

Five petals per flower, white petals with yellow center; fruit splits open when ripe, exposing flattened seed with tiny hairs which allow it to float or cling to animal fur.

Ecological Contributions to Lake Champlain

- Submerged portions provide habitat for many *micro- and macro- invertebrates (9, 10).* These invertebrates in turn are used as food by fish and other wildlife species (e.g., amphibians, reptiles, and ducks).
- Decomposition by bacteria and fungi creates *detritus (7)*, food for many aquatic invertebrates.
